## WCPS Curriculum Intent for French

At Wymondham College Prep School we believe that learning a modern foreign language increases children's cultural capital and generates a curiosity of another culture. We want to ensure that all children leave our school with a secure understanding of the basics of French. We will work on building the children's confidence to speak French in the classroom through using *La Joile* Ronde scheme and take part in dialogue and group discussions. We feel that it is important to introduce pupils to French culture and traditions. We aim promote an enjoyment of languages and for pupils to understand and recognise the value of speaking a foreign language.
