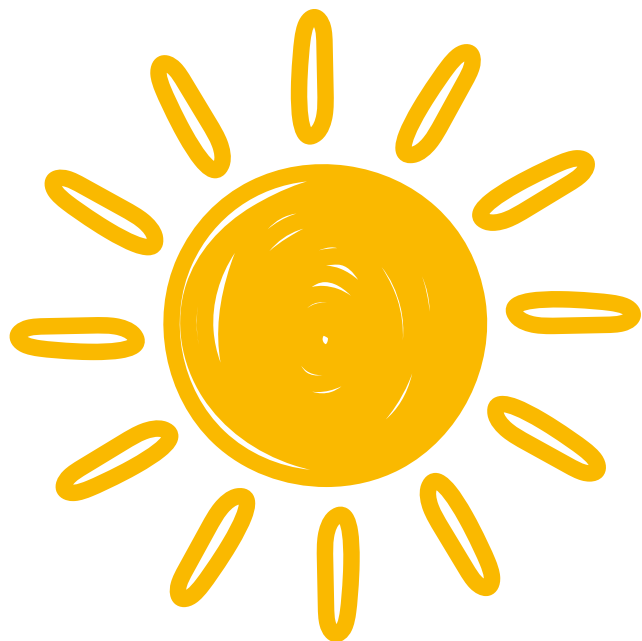

Reception Rabbits & Robins

This week, we have been learning about the oceans of the world, discussing how they are similar and different from one another. In Phonics, we have been exploring how to add the suffixes -ed and -est to root words, while in handwriting we have completed our final two letter formations, z and k. The children are becoming increasingly confident at forming both lower-case and capital letters correctly. In PSHE, we have continued talking about the transition to Year One, and the children are excited for their practice mornings next week. On Tuesday, we enjoyed practising our Sports Day races, including the sprint and the bean bag balancing race. We finished the week with a wonderful visit to the College to perform at the Gala. Rabbits and Robins sang their Minibeast songs beautifully, and we were incredibly proud of their confidence and enthusiasm.

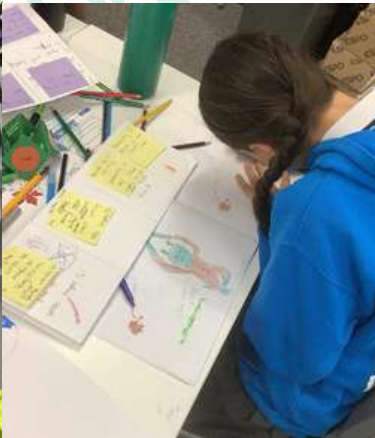

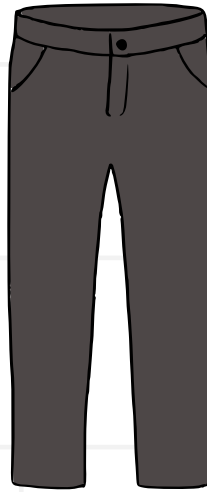
Year 6 Lions & Jaguars
