
Seeing and hearing about their nerves before going and then seeing and hearing the buzz and bounce they came back into school with afterwards summed up 'the why' we do these things.


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Year 4 Eagles & Owls

Important roadworks information

A11 southbound entry and exit slip road closures at Station Road and Browick Road – removal and replacement of lighting

I'm writing to tell you that we plan to carry out a removal and replacement of lighting on the A11 southbound at the Station Road entry and exit slip roads, this will also include the fly over bridges.

LED lights are better for the environment and use far less energy to produce the same amount of light. They also last longer and require less maintenance, meaning fewer road closures to fix lighting in the future and more importantly, safer roads for everyone. Once completed, drivers will benefit from the A11 remaining in a safe and serviceable condition.

We plan to complete this work over **six weeks** starting from **Monday 2 February 2026**. We will work overnight between **8pm** and **6am** on **weeknights** only, weather permitting.

Closures and diversions

To carry out the work safely, we will need to close the A11 southbound entry and exit slip roads at Station Road which will include the A11 flyover bridge, and divert traffic as detailed in the table overleaf.

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
