Reception Rabbits & Robins

We have been enjoying lots of activities linked to Autumn this week, as well as thinking more about emotions. The children have made some lovely leaf people for our creative activity and the conker activities have been very popular. In English we have learnt the 4 new sounds ck (a 'digraph') e u r and also the new tricky word 1. We have been writing cvc words containing the sounds that we have learnt so far. In Maths we have been creating and continuing patterns eg ABAB and AABAAB patterns. We have been talking about how we might feel when we are in the 'red zone' (angry/frustrated) and this links nicely with our English unit 'On Sudden Hill'. The children were excited to have the nurses come in for the height and weight checks!







Year 1 Otters & Seals

We have had a lovely week in Otters and Seals. This week we enjoyed being out and about in Woodland Wonder sessions, looking for signs of autumn in the forest. Back in the classroom during science, we have discussed seasonal changes and made some posters to show our learning. In maths we have been working on our number bond skills, learning how to work systematically to find all of them for a given number. In Art, we enjoyed hearing about a child named Austin and the process he went through to improve his drawing skills. We replicated Austin's project, working in pairs to give each other kind and helpful feedback on how we could improve. By the end, we had all produced a lovely, realistic butterfly drawing!

Year 2 Badgers & Foxes

In Year 2 this week, we have been using base ten and ten frames to add and subtract from 10 and across 10 barriers. showing great progress in our maths skills. In English, the children began their independent writing pieces inspired by The Great Flood of London, producing some fantastic ideas. We also continued exploring materials in science and DT by building our own wheeled vehicles and investigating the properties of different materials through hands-on activities.





Year 3 Dragonflies & Bumblebees

In Dragonfly and Bumblebee Class, we've had a busy and exciting week! As part of our geography topic, we completed traffic surveys to explore how our school has affected the local community — both positively and negatively. In maths, we've been spotting patterns and practising adding and subtracting 1's and 10's to three-digit numbers with growing confidence. In English, we began diving into the book 'The Incredible Book Eating Boy' and imagined what different books might taste like do mystery stories taste spicy? Or fairy tales sweet? We used alliteration and punctuation to capture just how wonderfully wacky book eating is for the main character in our fictional story.


